1 Stop 1: Cedarbrook Lodge – Sweet Beginnings in the Wetlands

Your Honey Month journey begins at Cedarbrook Lodge, a hidden hive of tranquility near Sea-Tac Airport. Amid 18 acres of restored wetlands and native gardens, you'll find a serene escape buzzing with life, including the on-site apiary curated by local beekeeper Daniel Sullivan of Shipwreck Honey. As the leaves turn and the air cools, explore walking trails past the koi pond, enjoy a honey-infused cocktail by the fire, or sample locally sourced bites that celebrate the season. Whether you're visiting the Museum of Flight or catching a sunset at nearby Alki Beach, the day winds down sweetly in this peaceful oasis where nature and flavor flourish side by side.



2 Stop 2: The Lodge at St. Edward - Wild, Playful, & Dripping with Gold

Next, follow the honey trail to The Lodge at St. Edward State Park, where fall adventure meets forest magic. Tucked into 326 acres of lush woodland, this reimagined historic landmark hosts another of Daniel Sullivan's buzzing apiaries, with golden Shipwreck Honey inspiring the lodge's seasonal menus and creative cocktails. Spot wildlife from the shoreline, kayak across Lake Washington, or bike forested trails before winding down with a warm honey cider in the Tonsorium Bar. The playful energy of the lodge blends perfectly with the earthy richness of Honey Month, offering a sweet pause between outdoor thrills and cozy comforts.



Stop 3: Salish Lodge & Spa - A Golden Finish by the Falls

Conclude your road trip with a sweet finale at Salish Lodge & Spa, where Honey Month shines brightest. Home to the original Shipwreck Honey apiary, Salish honors the harvest with seasonal spa treatments, culinary delights, and signature house honey sourced right on the hillside. Sip a honey bourbon by the fireplace, indulge in a warm honey scrub at the spa, or simply breathe in the crisp fall air as Snoqualmie Falls roars below. Surrounded by golden trees and the hum of bees preparing for winter, Salish invites you to slow down, soak in the moment, and savor the season's most natural indulgence: honey.
